Paris now LTTE's latest killing field

COLOMBO, May 20 — (Lankapuvath) Paris is the LTTE's latest killing field to liquidate its rivals.

Reports reaching Lankapuvath from the French capital on Friday, state that following the brutal murder of S. Sabalingam an anti LTTE Tamil author in the presence of his wife at his flat at No.3, Abee Paul Leautaud in Paris on May Day, LTTE hit squads have murdered four more Tamils in

Paris.

The reports state that the latest victims were Newton who had been

gunned down by the terrorists at La Chapelle, Paris. (Over to page 3)

Kanagasabai Kantharupasingam at Angerville, Essonne and two other Tamils critical of the LTTE, at Sir Hakeim Metro Station in Paris.

The French police were reported investigating the LTTE massacre of five Tamils critical of the group within a little over two weeks.

The reports from Paris state that the first victim Sabalingam had been once a close associate of LTTE leader Prabhakaran and even nursed him after he was injured by a bomb he was manufacturing.

But, he had later openly accused the LTTE leader of treachery in connection with the Neerveli bank robbery and the arrest of Kuttimani and was organising an anti LTTE group among Europe-based Tamil literateurs.

Meanwhile, the Indian

ministry of home affairs has referred to the LTTE as an organisation based in Sri Lanka, but having sympathisers, supporters and agents on Indian soil.

The Indian government which has extended the ban on the LTTE has stated that the LTTE was threatening the sovereignty and territorial integrity of India. It had created the Tamil retrieval forge and Tamil Passarai.

The Indian government has further stated the LTTE is trying to infiltrate its cadres supported with sophisticated arms and ammunition and with logistics support in Tamilnadu — also to establish safe-houses in the South Indian state.

The LTTE had also held out threats to eliminate witnesses in the Rajiv Gandhi Assassination case.
