Athletes go missing from games in Victoria

By Bob MITCHELL STAFF REPORTER Six African track and field athletes and a Sri Lankan box-er, competing in the Common-wealth Games in Victoria, have been reported missing. A spectator at the games claims he spotted the six Gha-naian athletes yesterday, leav-ing a Toronto-bound Grey-hound bus in Sudbury. They had last been seen Wednesday at the athletes' vil-lage at the University of Victo-ria. The Sri Lankan boxer was reported missing Thursday. "They were definitely on the bus," Tijjani Omar said in an interview at the Bay St. bus ter-minal yesterday. "There were three men and three women and they all car-ried adidas gym bags," said Omar, a former Nigerian now living in New York who went to see his former countrymen com-pete. "They kept to themselves. see pete. "They spo

"They kept to themselves. They spoke English. I didn't try to talk to them. I had a friend on the bus and we talked all the way so I didn't feel obliged to talk to them. I didn't know there was anything wrong."

MAY SEEK ASYLUM The missing track and field-athletes are identified as Kofi Yevakpor, 22, Awuku Boateng, 20, Tanko Abass, 19, Martha Edusei, 19, Nabiama Salifu, 18, and Philomina Mensah, 19. Also missing is Ilandari Ku-lantunge, 26. Omar said he didn't think Kulantunge was on the bus.

the bus. Omar said the Ghanaian ath-letes boarded the bus in Van-couver on Thursday night. The bus stopped briefly in Calgary, Winnipeg and Sudbury, where they boarded another bus for Montreal about 11 a.m. yester-day. day.

Commonwealth Games offi-cials said it's possible the ath-letes may seek asylum or refu-gee status in Canada. Police said there's no suspicion of foul play. Athletes at the games have a six-month visa to stay in Can-ada.

None of the athletes had won medals at the games. The Gha-naians were scheduled to run in the men's relay races yesterday and the women's relay today.
