But the President does not want to reveal his plans," the Central Provincial Council's Chief Minister W. P. B. Dissanayake declared. He was speaking on the occasion of the opening of a new building at Udunuwara Parshada Maha Vidyalaya recently. The

two storeyed building has been built at a cost of Rs. 1.1 million.

The Chief Minister said, a bright era has now dawned for Udunuwara. The entire country has been lit up with that illumination and there was no doubt that the brightness will continue for many years to come.

The entire country has the highest respect for the voters of Udunuwara for electing a President with great strength to lead the nation towards a bright and prosperous future.
